Dear Fellow Members of the FMSCI

It gives me immense pleasure to welcome you all to this 49<sup>th</sup> Annual General Body Meeting of our Federation.

The sport at large took a massive hit in the early part of 2020 as well as 2021. Nevertheless, the V-shaped recovery thanks to the determination and will of the motor sporting fraternity has created ripples of appreciation and respect from one and all across the globe following Indian Motorsport.

The year 2022 has seen the sport grow even more robustly and I wish to thank the entire motor sporting fraternity for their support and cooperation extended to the FMSCI to help it tide over troubled times and come out stronger than ever before.

I also wish to thank the FIA, FIM, FIA-CIK and the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, GOI, for their unstinted support to assist the FMSCI in further developing the sport in India.

I would like to congratulate our new FIA President, Mohammed Ben Sulayem who won with a thumping majority in the last FIA AGA held in Paris in December 2021. His vision for the FIA and all its member clubs is astounding and the progress made in the very first 6 months of his tenure is exemplary. It is also with great humility; I would like to thank President Mohammed and the FIA World Motor Sports Council in appointing me as the FIA Karting Commission President which automatically inducts me as a member of the FIA World Motor Sports Council.

I would like to congratulate Mr Nitin Dossa from the Western India Automobile Association, Mumbai for being elected as the Vice President of the FIA World Mobility Council in December 2021 which is again another first for an Indian in the field of mobility and Mr B.S. Sujith Kumar for being elected as the Vice President of FIM Asia in 2022.

It is also of great significance that we have 28 members from India representing our country in multiple sporting and non-sporting commissions in the FIA, FIM and FIA-CIK Commissions.

I would like to highlight below some of the important big ticket international and national sporting events and achievements that we have closed out on in 2022.

**FIA Formula E round comes to India:**

It is with a great sense of pride that I inform you of the agreement signed between Greenko and the promoters of the FIA Formula E Championship and the FIA to bring a round of the FIA Formula E Championship to India in February 2023 in Hyderabad at the first FIA Grade 2 street circuit ( certification in process ) being built and promoted by Mega Engineering Industries Ltd, Hyderabad.

The Telangana Government is also fully supporting this venture.

This will certainly change the landscape of Indian motorsport and will be the launching pad for India to introduce more classes of racing, rallying and karting from the bottom end of the pyramid with sustainable energy and will bring together all the industrial power houses in India to get more involved in the electric vertical of the sport.

**FIA Formula Regional (F3) & FIA Formula 4 (F4) comes to India:**

Racing Promotions Ltd, India (RPL) along with the FMSCI signed another historic agreement with the FIA in 2022 to introduce the FIA Formula Regional and FIA Formula 4 Championship in India from November 2022. RPL has also signed up with the world famous racing team “ Prema Racing “ to oversee the operations of the FR & F4 cars in the 5 round championship in India in November & December 2022 which will be run at the Buddh International Circuit, Madras International Circuit and the Hyderabad International Street Circuit.

More importantly, the participating drivers in both championships will secure the most valuable FIA driver points which helps talented drivers climb the ladder eventually up to Formula 1. This will see multiple international drivers competing with our Indian drivers for the coveted FIA Titles.

**Indian Racing League:**

Racing Promotions Ltd (RPL) have relaunched the Indian Racing League which is a city-based franchise racing league, the first of its kind in the world. RPL will be introducing the Wolf sports cars from 2022 and are in the process of finalizing the 8 franchisees which will again see well reputed international drivers, male & female being paired with the talented Indian drivers. The IRL will run along with the FIA Formula Regional & FIA Formula 4 Championship. Hopefully in the years to come, this will be the IPL of racing.

**FIA Rally Star Continental Shoot Out:**

The FIA Rally Star Cup promoted by the FIA is a talent hunt program launched by the FIA to identify a young talented rally driver from across the globe and provide him with a fully sponsored drive in the FIA World Rally Championship in the WRC 3 Class. Each country conducts their shoot outs via a digital program and an on track slalom gymkhana program and the FIA then conducts the continental shoot outs using the cross-cars which then leads to the finalists from each continent vying for the final place for the Rally Star scholarship. The FIA has chosen the Madras International Circuit to conduct the Asia Pacific Continental shoot out to select the top driver from the Asia Pacific region in September 2022.

**FIA Asia Cup Rally Championship round in India:**

India hosted a round of the FIA Asia Rally Cup which is part of the FIA Asia Pacific Rally Championship in Chennai organized by Madras Motor Sports Club, Chennai in 2022 and the top 5 gets an automatic entry into the Asia Pacific Rally Championship finals in 2022.

**FIA Asia Pacific Digital Race Event to be conducted in September 2022:**

India will host the Asia Pacific Single seater Esports Championship for driver's aged above 14 years. They will be held on September 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and October 29<sup>th</sup>. A maximum of 4 driver's per ASN will be granted entry into the Asia Pacific Single Seater E-Sports Championship 2022.

**FIM Mini GP India:**

In 2022, Tantra and Tech Pvt Ltd signed an agreement with the FMSCI to host the FIM Mini GP World Series in India under license from Dorna ( FIM Moto GP & Mini GP Promoters ) and the FIM. The Mini GP World Series is for young riders from the age group of 10 to 14. The top 15 riders selected to participate in the series are fully funded by the organizers and the top 3 winners will get a fully sponsored entry into the FIM World Mini Championship Finals in Valencia in 2022.

**FIM Moto GP round in India:**

We have been informed by the potential promoters that they are on the cusp of finalizing their agreement with the promoters of the FIM World Moto GP to include a round of the championship in India in 2023. We have been working very closely with the promoters as well as with the promoters and FIM to enable this to happen. We are informed that an announcement should be made prior to September 15<sup>th</sup> 2022.

If this transforms into reality, it will once again change the landscape of motorcycle racing in India and put India on the global map of motorcycle racing.

**New FIA Licensed racing circuits coming up in India:**

Currently, there are 3 new circuit dossiers submitted to the FIA Circuit Commission for analysing and sanctioning.

The Grade 2 Hyderabad International Street Circuit will be the first of its kind in India. Work on all the FIA certified concrete barriers and catch fencing has already commenced and the circuit is expected to be ready by November 2022 and will be in the heart of the city of Hyderabad and will host the FIA Formula 3 & Formula 4 races as well as a round of the FIA Formula E World Championship. This is being promoted by the Mega Engineering group from Telangana.

The Grade 2 CoASST circuit coming up in Coimbatore is under development and is expected to be ready in 2023 as per information from the promoters. This is a joint development between Mumbai Falcons Racing Ltd, Pune and the Coimbatore Auto Sports Trust.

The Grade 3 Nanoli Racing Circuit is also under construction and expected to be ready by mid-2023 and is located along the Mumbai-Pune highway.

**New FIA-CIK Karting Circuits coming up in India:**

Karting in India is also set to get a big boost with multiple large circuits coming up in India in different cities which will further evolve the continuous growth of professional karting in India.

Currently, there are 4 applications being made to the FIA-CIK for approval and they are by MMRT - Chennai, Mumbai Falcons – Pune, Bangalore International Circuit – Bengaluru, CoASTT – Coimbatore. All these circuits are expected to be ready in 2023 and will be capable of hosting National & International Karting Championships.

**International Karting Championships to be launched in India in 2023:**

Talks are on to bring the Rotax Grand Finals and a round of the FIA-CIK Regional & World Championship events to India when the new circuits under construction are complete. This again will put India on the world map of karting which will give a tremendous boost to the young Indian karting drivers.

**Indian Team wins FIA Asian Formula 3 Championship in 2022:**

Mumbai Falcons Racing Team won the FIA Formula 3 Regional Racing Championship in 2022. This was a tremendous achievement and a first in the history of Indian Motorsport. The Mumbai Falcons Racing Team have now created a strong platform for young Indian drivers doing well in the Indian Championships to get a seat in the Mumbai Falcons Asian Racing team.

**National Championships in 2022:**

Our 4W, 2W & Karting National Championships have record entries in 2022. This is largely due to the effort taken by all the promoters and organizers who have put their heart and soul into developing these championships into iconic events. With all the new racing and karting tracks coming up, I am confident that this record participation will double within the next two years. Below is a list of the current National Championships taking place in India.

**Manufacturer's involvement in the Sport:**

We have seen an unprecedented growth in the involvement of manufacturers in the sport from JK Tyres, MRF, Mahindra, Volkswagen, Yokohama, Honda, Hero, Suzuki, TVS, Yamaha, Rolon, KTM, Royal Enfield etc. Their investments into the sport have been substantial and their future plans look even more promising.

Mahindra Racing has surely and truly stamped their name in International Motorsport with astounding results in the Formula E Championship.

The 2W segment has been no less in terms of growth in the involvement of manufacturers in the sport. It is also very satisfying to see manufacturers now competing against each other and supporting private teams in the National Championship. Honda, Suzuki, TVS and Yamaha have further consolidated their single make classes running along with the National 2W & 4W Racing Championships. This has allowed young riders to graduate into the National Racing Championships. It is also gratifying to note of the support given by Honda, Suzuki, TVS and Yamaha to their talented riders in International Championships.

Hero Moto Corp and TVS have invested heavily in the off road segment and are fielding teams and supporting riders in the various international CCR events including that of the Dakar Rally.

**Indians in International Events:**

Indian drivers led by Jehan Daruvala participating in the FIA Formula 2 Championship and Kush Maini participating in the FIA Formula 3 Championship have secured multiple podiums in the championship in 2022. Jehan has also tested with the McLaren Formula 1 team and we now look forward to having him as the next Indian driver in Formula 1.

**Women in Motorsport Commission**

The Women In Motorsport Commission has gone from strength to strength. The interest and participation level of women in various grass root and national level championships has increased tremendously as well as the involvement in the V&O and Medical platforms. The WIM India is also actively participating in all the FIA and FIM Asia Zone seminars as well as being very well represented by the WIM Commission chairperson in the FIA WIM Commission as well as in the FIM WIM Commission.

**In Closing**

I would like to place on record my sincere appreciation to my fellow Councillors, Chairman of all the Commissions and Committees, FMSCI officials and volunteers, Member Clubs, Sponsors, Media, Manufacturers, Government of India, FIA, FIM and the CIK, Competitors, Parents, and all the motorsport enthusiasts. Your support and guidance has been immense and I would like to thank you all for contributing towards the development of Indian Motorsport.

My personal appreciation and gratitude to the hard working Secretariat. The quantum and quality of work done by these selfless people is outstanding.

I would also like to thank our Chartered Accountants, Legal advisors & Company Law consultant for their unstinted support and advice given to keep the FMSCI as water tight as possible.

I would like to congratulate each and every Commission head along with their Commission members for doing a wonderful job and being the core of the sport. It has been hard work and a lot of time has been spent by these wonderful people. My heart goes out to all the competitors and teams in the manner in which they have competed till date. The quality and skill levels have improved tremendously over the years across the board and they are the true brand ambassadors of this sport and the country.

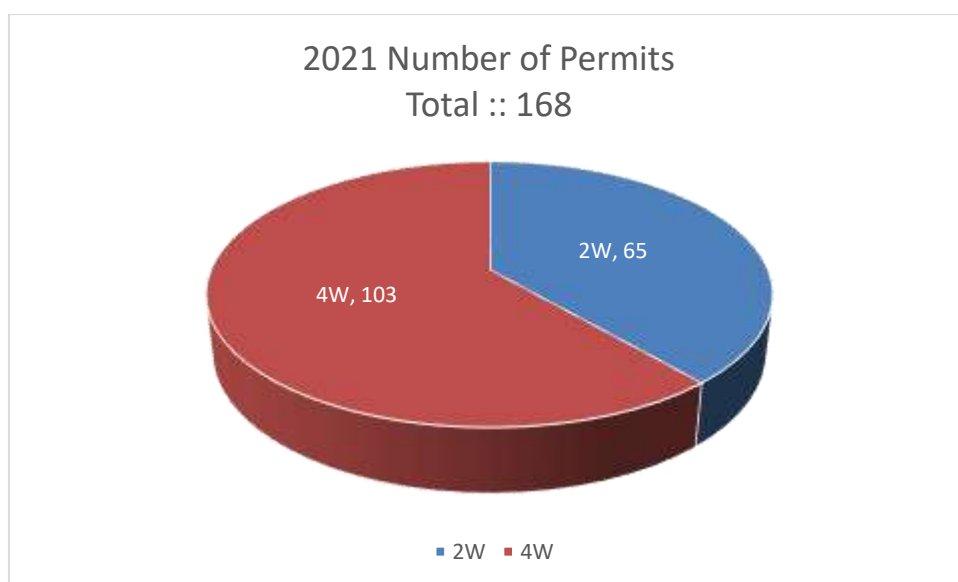

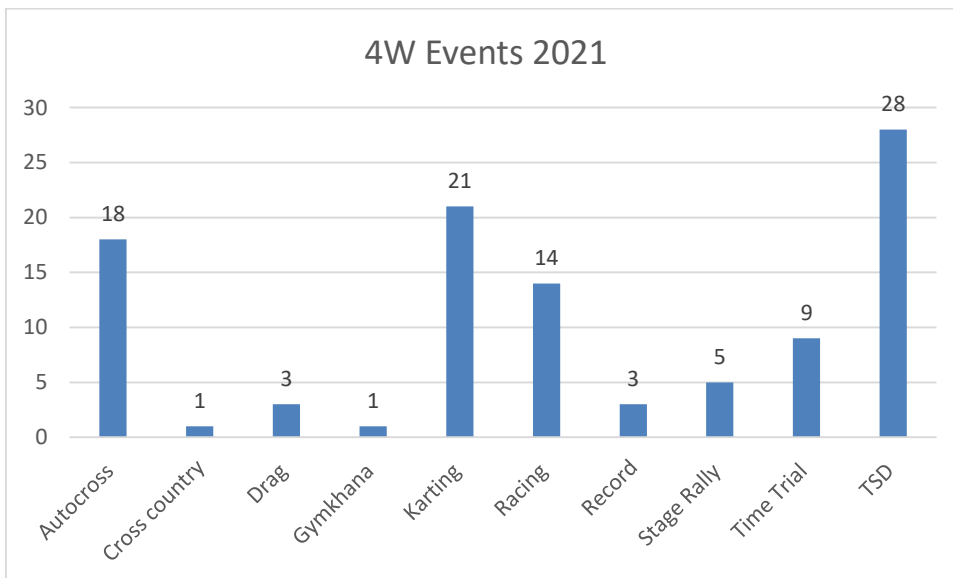
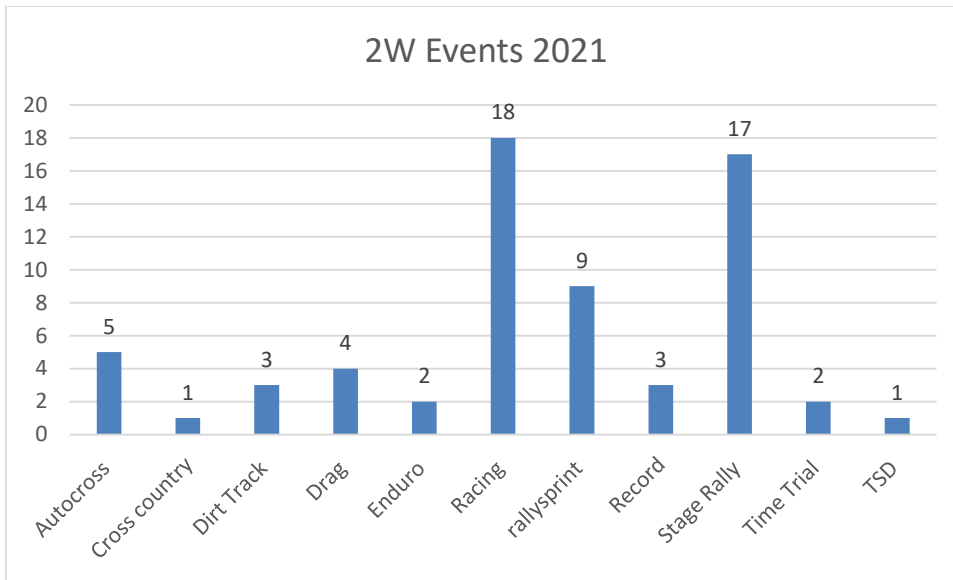
